



### QUALITY




Americans' thoughts and actions have been undergoing twenty-five years of change--changes of a basic nature affecting every one of our lives and those of future generations.


The French Club, under the direction of Miss Chase, has had another successful year. The club has helped its members to further their knowledge of the French language and culture.


