## THEY ARE THE VOICE OF THE STUDENTS






## DRIVERS' EDUCATION

## THE SILVER A



Silver "A" pins, emblems of outstanding sportmanship, are awarded by the Student Council to not more than twelve pupils at the end of each school year. The awards are made in accordance with the following plan.

- I. All pupils attending Arms Academy are eligible.
- II. Pupils are to be judged on the following points in equal degree:
  - LOYALTY
  - ATTITUDE
  - CHARACTER
  - DISPOSITION
  - COOPERATION
- III. Two pupils from each class may be chosen by a committee from each class, consisting of three members of the class and the two Faculty Advisors.
- IV. Two boys and two girls may be chosen from the entire school by a committee consisting of three members of the Student Council, and the Faculty Advisor.
  - Note: The committee of the Student Council may not choose any member of the Council, nor shall any class committee choose any of its own members.
- V. All decisions made by the committees are final. The Student Council has adopted these regulations and will award the Silver A's in compliance with them.


## FOOTBALL
