




IRA ARMS

Major Ira Arms, the benefactor of Arms Academy, left a trust fund of \$20,000 for the founding of an academy which would "foster intellectual, moral, and religious growth among the youth of the community." As a result of this fund and a grant of land Arms Academy was incorporated in 1860, yet the original private institution, Arms Academy, was not built until some twenty years after his death. To Ira Arms we owe our gratitude for the establishment of the public high school which now annually enrolls approximately 300 students.

The lessons

This year marks the 100th anniversary of the incorporation of Arms Academy. Time has made its inevitable changes. Since the first building, known as the Academy building, two more have been added—Science Hall and Cowell Gymnasium. Instead of just one curriculum, as in the old days, Arms Academy now has six, namely College Preparatory, Commercial, General, Industrial Arts, Household Arts, and Agriculture.


Although the subjects and the methods by which they are taught have undergone changes, Arms Academy has continued to uphold its reputation of training young people in citizenship and scholarship.

Longfellow's motto—"Be a leader"—has always been the school's aim.



OUR PRINCIPAL SPEAKS






