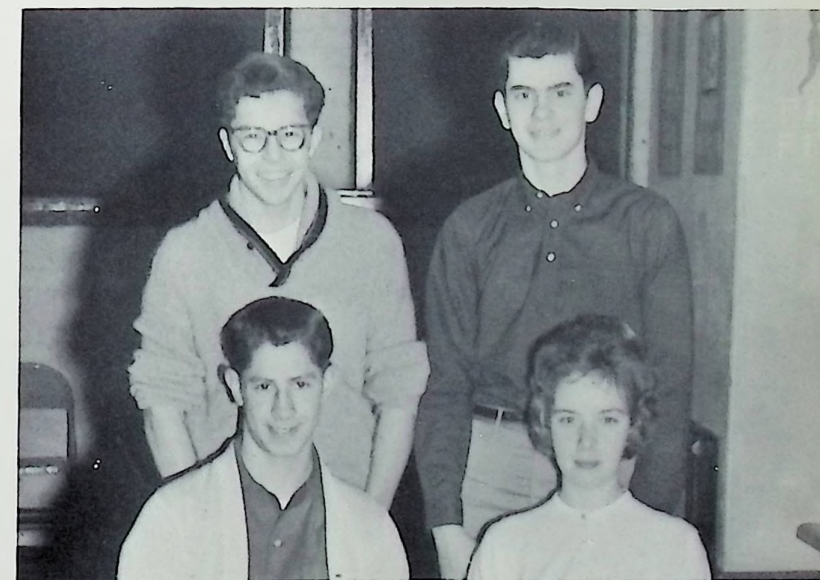
GERMAN CLUB

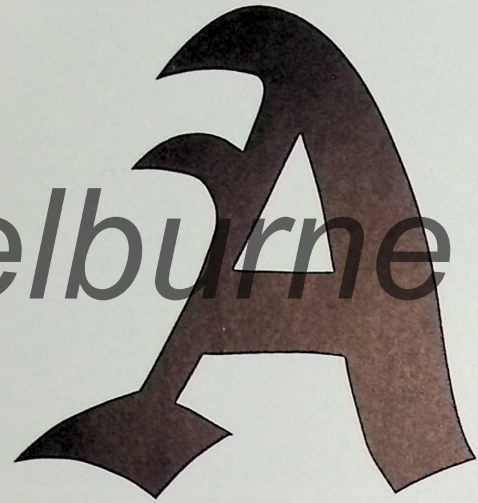

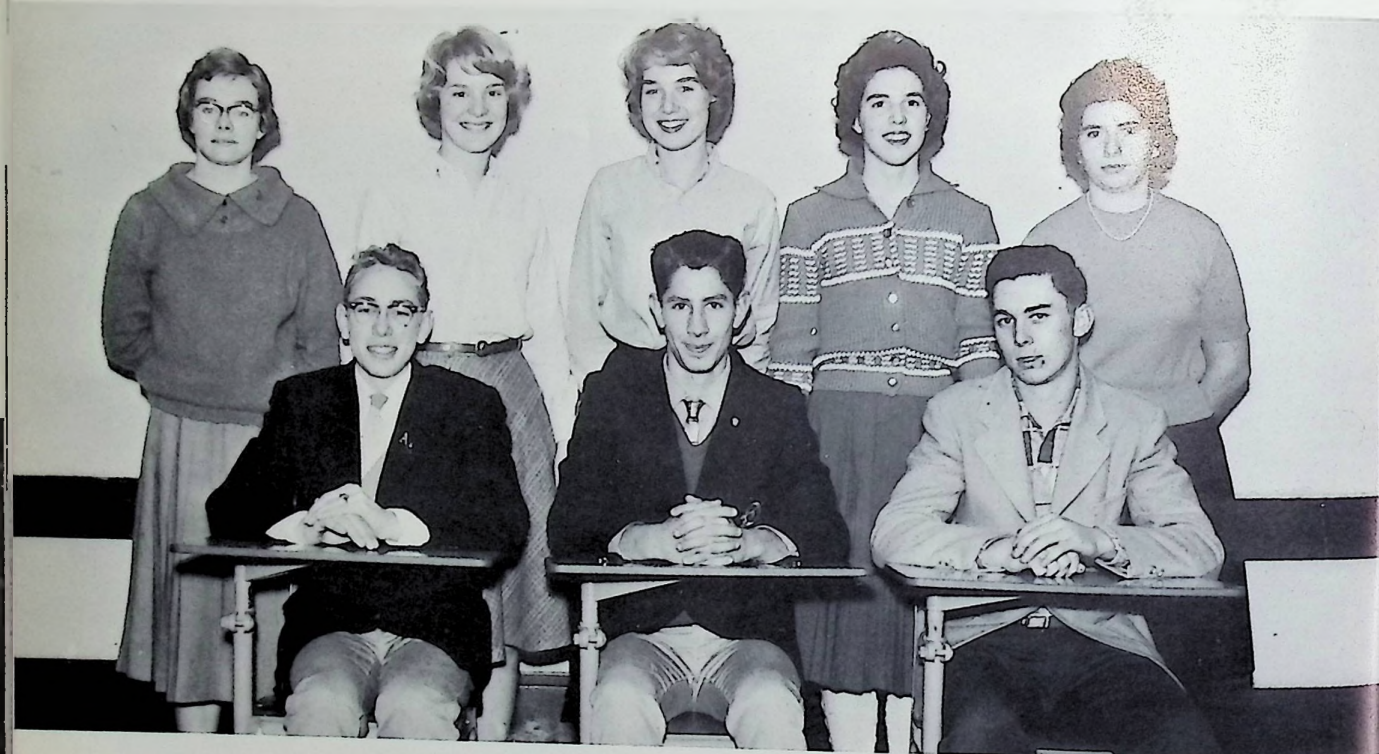

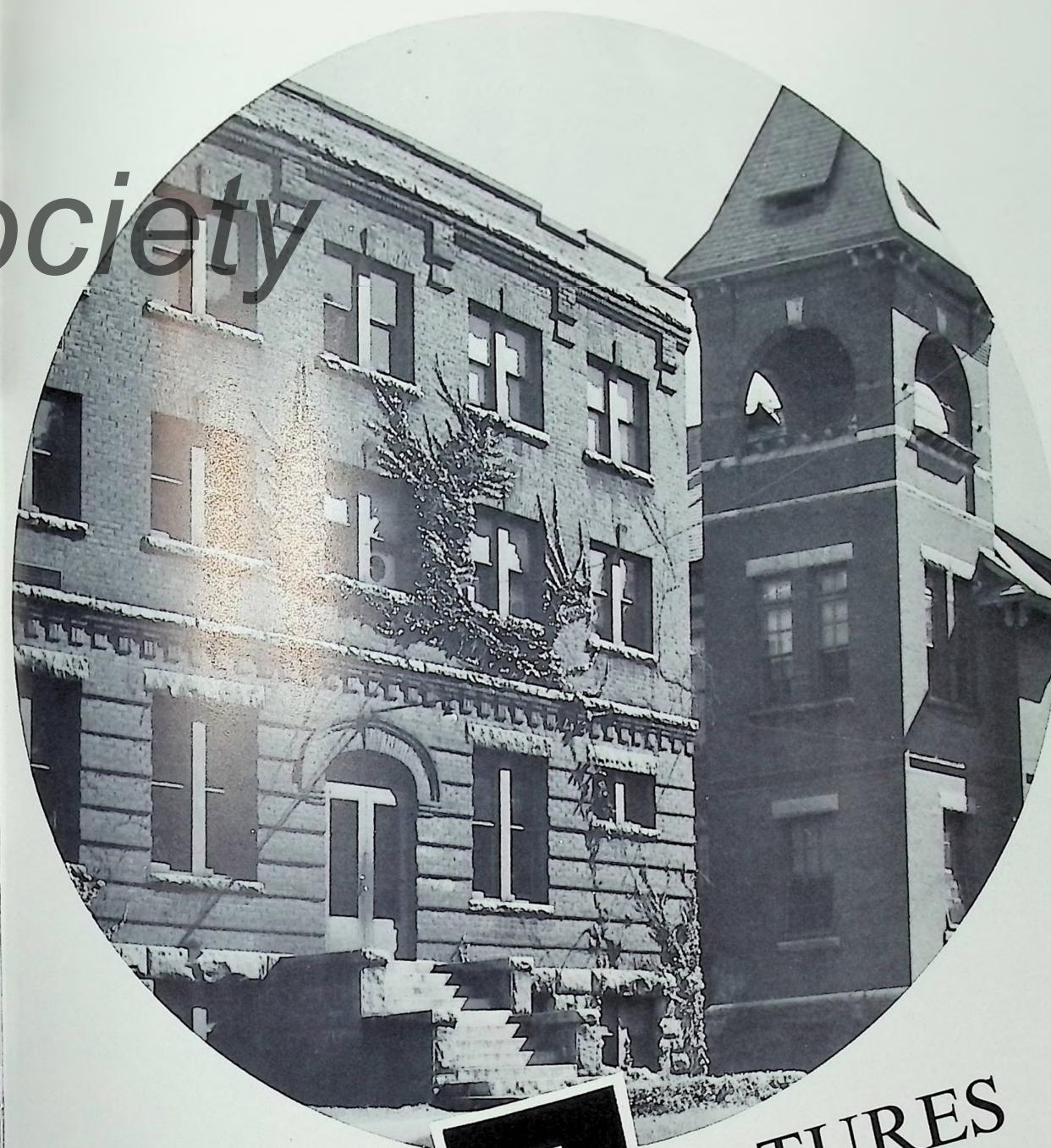


MAGAZINE DRIVE

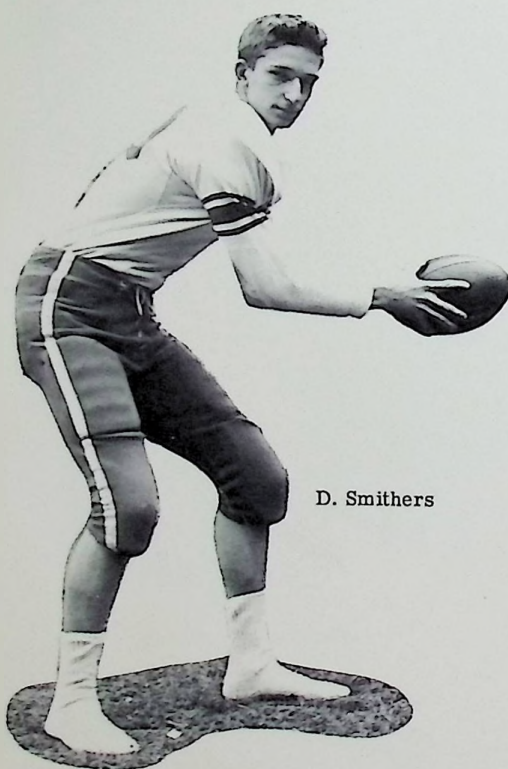
Football Fortunes Soar Sky-High
